


God bless you all.



### WOMEN EMPOWERMENT PROGRAMS

EMPOWERING COMMUNITIES FOR EFFECTIVE GOOD GOVERNANCE IN 15 VILLAGES OF TARIKERE TALUK – SUPPORTED BY MANOS UNIDAS SPAIN. PROJECT NO: IND 70729

The objective of the project is to improve the formation of the project staff and community members in order to help people to get their rights and entitlements.

During the year 2016-17, 308 trainings were conducted for 14523 beneficiaries of Tarikere, M.C. Halli, Lingadahalli, Krishnapura, Santaveri, Hospete, Mallenahalli, Rangenahalli and project staff on the Concept, roles and responsibilities of ward development committees, documentation and book keeping, Right based approach, leadership, government schemes, Mahatma Gandhi National Rural Employment Guarantee Act, Panchayath Raj Institutions, Public distribution System, Concept of formation of Civic Foras at Grama Panchayath level, its roles and responsibilities, formation of federations, self help groups for women, men and children.

#### **ACHIEVEMENTS**

- 30 ward development committees, 4 MGNREGA committees, 4 Civic Fora committees 20 women self help groups 10 men SHGs and 11 children groups are formed and are functioning as per the norms.
- The WDC members along with the villagers raised their voice against non-availability of drinking
  water in their respective panchayaths... 3 overhead tanks are constructed, 2 overhead tanks are cleaned
  and 15 irrigations water tanks are filled with water once in two days. The old and rusted pipelines
  are replaced with the new once in Udeva, Mallenahalli and Krishnapura.



- The participation of women in Grama sabha, ward sabha and social audit has been increased from 40% to 65%.
- 30% of the women have worked for MGNREGA and are economically benefited. 5% of the beneficiaries
  have dug percolation pits, farm ponds and gully plugs in their land to improve the fertility of the land.
- · 125 beneficiaries constructed sanitary toilets and are using the same.
- 594 beneficiaries availed different government facilities worth Rs.2,12,06,000/-
- 4 PDS shops are functioning as per the norms after creating awareness to the vigilance committee members on PDS Act.

Empowerment of Socio-Economically Poor and Disadvantaged Women in Karnataka (Arsikere and Hassan) Implemented by KROSS, Bengaluru (B.H. Misereor-Germany)

#### GOAL OF THE PROJECT:

2800 Socio economically poor women and their families in 41 villages of Hassan district enjoy safety and secured life free of atrocities and violence and contribute towards Women empowerment and rights protection.



#### **ACHIEVEMENTS**

- 2 Women Cooperative societies are formed and registered under the Cooperative Societies Act at Hassan viz., Vanitha Jyothi, Arsikere and Spoorty, Hassan. They received an amount of Rs. 1, 00,000/- each towards share to 400 women shareholders.
- · 19 irrigations water tanks were installed and the scarcity of water is reduced by 20%.
- · Sanitary toilets are constructed and used by 512 families under the Swatch Bharath Yojane.




- 25 pipe line connections were given in 10 villages in 4 Grama Panchayaths and drinking water is made available to the villagers once in two days.
- 12 cases against the atrocities are registered in Santhvana Kendra and Women Police station. Out of
  which 6 cases are settled in Santvana Kendra and Women police Station, 3 cases are solved with the help
  of federation leaders and two cases are settled by the village and religious leaders.
- 450 SHG and Federation members along with the villagers participated in the Protest rally against sanctioning licensed liquor shop in Gadenahalli. As a result the decision has been withdrawn by Excise Department and Grama Panchayath.
- 395 women have taken loan from SHG's and federations of Rs. 1,01,10,850.00 and have started IGP activities like Cow rearing, Tailoring unit, Vegetable business and Agriculture.

Integrated Development of Marginalized women and their families in Koppa and N.R.Pura Taluks supported by Caritas Prague, Czech Republic

### GOAL OF THE PROJECT

2000 socio-economically marginalized women and their families from 60 villages in Koppa and N.R. Pura taluks exercise fundamental rights and lead a self-reliant and dignified life.



- 685 members paid their duties to Government
- 30 SHG members started income generation activities like Cow rearing, goat rearing, Petty shop, Piggery, selling of vegetables, fruits etc.
- 11 SHG members have constructed houses under Asharaya Yojane and are dwelling in it.



# Integrated Child Development Programm (ICDP) supported by CARITAS-Prague Czech Republic

The main objective of this project is financial assistance for the education of the economically disadvantaged children across Hassan and Chikmagalur Districts irrespective of caste and creed..

174 children are supported across the Diocese of chikmagalur. Children between class 1 to 10 (43 Nos), Class XI to XII (44 Nos), class XIII to XVII (59 Nos) and Vocational Course (16 Nos). 12 children have completed their education and are working in various jobs. Awareness was given on leadership qualities, values of life, Health and hygiene, importance of Education, Gender sensitization, Skill of writing letter to their donors, etc.

#### CHRISTMAS GET TOGETHER

The children and their parents participated in the Christmas celebrations conducted at CMSSS and Balehonnur. They were distributed Christmas gifts and those who exhibited their talents won the prizes.

### Mainstreaming of Persons with Disabilities-Supported by Community based Rehabilitation Forum, Bengaluru

#### PROJECT NO. 2015/018/CBR 16

1064 people with disabilities (PWDs) are indentified during the year and formed 152 village differently abled peoples organizations (VDPOs), 9 Taluk Federations and 2 District Federations. Trainings are conducted on Advocacy, Lobbying and Networking and dialogues with Government offices to fight for their Rights. The government entitlements availed by the PWDs are 397 Social security pension, 58 Housing, 26 Sanitary toilets, 107 Scooties from MLA fund, 8 DPOs has got revolving fund from Government, 6 PWDs has got financial support for livelihood activities from 3% reservation fund. 5 PWDs have settled in their family life. We have received from Canara Bank Hassan Rs. 1,72,500/- under CSR fund for the AIDS and Appliances.

Lighting the Homes of the Marginalized Women in Hassan and chikmagalur Districts
Through Solar Energy Options.

Supported by: The Diocese of ROTTENBURG - STUTTGART - GERMANY Project No: 2016-1-35135

This is an unique project by which 500 solar lanterns were distributed to the marginalized women of Hassan and Chikmagalur Districts. 2250 women of cluster federations participated in 45 trainings on renewable energy options, its importance and handling measures. The lanterns distributed are very handy and can be carried from one place to another. The solar lanterns burn 3 to 4 hours daily and thus the use of electricity has reduced. The electricity bills of the families have come down by Rs. 50/- to 75/- per month. More and more women in the self help groups are opting for solar lights by learning the advantages of the solar lanterns from the Federation members.



Providing Entrepreneurial Life Training For the School dropout Youth, in the districts of Hassan and Chikmagalur.

Supported by : Functional Vocational Training & Research Society (FVTRS) Bengaluru
Project No. VT-560/KA-SR/2016

Under this program we have trained in the 1st batch 45 school dropout youth in Garment making, Beautician, four wheeler Driving and Mechanism course in Hassan & Chikmagalur Districts. Four wheelers Driving students have got their Driving License from the department of Road Transport. 20 of them are self employed and others are seeking jobs. Now in the 2nd batch 45 youth are trained in different trades at Chikmagalur and Mudigere.

**Collaboration and Certification:** The certificates to the participants are issued with collaboration of Nehru Yuvaka Kendra and CMSSS.



#### Other Project Activities of CMSSS

#### Family Development program (FDP) -Supported by Save a Family Plan- Kerala-India

- 1. 256 families are receiving regularly monthly support to various income generation activities for sustainable living
- Every month central level meetings and quarterly Regional level meetings are organized. Training are conducted on entrepreneurial development programme (EDP), income generation activity, letter writing, maintenance of individual handbook, bank passbook etc
- 3. 9 families have constructed new houses, 8 families have purchased site for house construction.



#### Jeevan Jyothi Federation(JJF)

Though this Federation was existing from 1998 with a MOU, we registered it under Cooperative Society Act 1960 on 31-08-2016 bearing No. 100/2016-17. As of now 473 SHGs of Hassan and Chikmagalur have taken membership by paying an amount of Rs.5000/- each as their share amounting to Rs. 23,65,000/-.17 board members are chosen among the 32 federations of 2 civil districts who meet thrice a year for the governing board meeting and take decisions on various issues to be addressed in the federations. A strict monitoring tool and a team along with the staff of CMSSS including the federation leaders is formed and every month the report and activities are monitored. They have also started a health scheme for the members of the federation to help the members of the federation in times of medical emergencies for which 1% of the total income of the federation will be utilized. In the last Annual General Body Meeting it is decided to felicitate the children of the SHG members who score more than 85% marks in SSLC, PUC, Degree and equivalent courses. As we are aiming for sustainability we found this is a good model that is taking forward the good works started by the organization and in the long run people take the ownership of all the works.






